

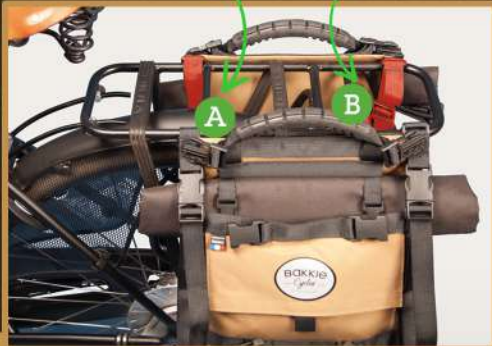

Clip-on and tighten straps **A** and **B**



Make sure that you can pedal normally. If you can't, you'll need a longer rack.

The bag can carry up to **20 kg** (44 lbs).

Adhere to the **maximum** weight limits of your bike and bag rack.

Make sure that nothing can get caught in the spokes.

Ride safely when your bike is loaded up.

2-year warranty



then LOAD UP

1. Loosen **C**
Unclip **D**



2. Insert your cargo or the front tire of a child's bike.



3. Clip **D** Tighten **C** and **D**

LUGGAGE

1. Weave one of the straps around the bike frame and tighten.



2. Weave the other strap around your bag rack and tighten. Your cargo should be secure and tight against your bike.

or a CHILD'S BIKE

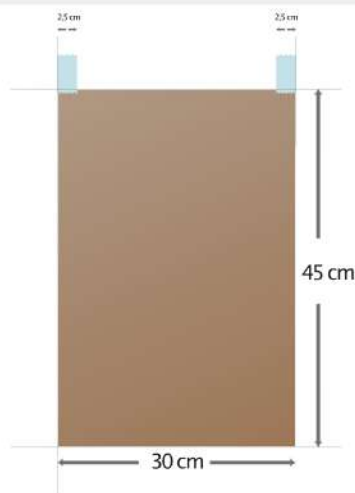
1. Weave one of the straps around the bike frame and tighten.



2. Weave the other strap around your bag rack and tighten. The tire should be secure and tight against the bike.

See if your bag rack is Bakkie-ready

As with all panniers, you must be able to pedal without the bags getting in your way. It's easy to check whether your bag rack is long enough – just do a quick test!



1 Cut a piece of cardboard or put together a couple sheets of paper so that they have the same measurements as the diagram. Then, attach pieces of tape as shown to make the bag "straps".

2 Next, attach your homemade bag to your bag rack, placing it as far back as possible, and making sure to line up the top of the "bag" with your rack's horizontal bar. The tape "straps" should be wrapped around the horizontal bar of your bag rack; in the same place you would wrap the actual straps.

3 Using a wall for balance, get on your bike and do a couple revolutions to see if the "bag" gets in your way while pedaling. Keep in mind that larger objects will stick out the back of the actual bag and won't get in your way.

If you think that you won't be able to pedal comfortably, all you need is a longer bag rack. We recommend the "Power Safety Carrier 35KG" by Steco.
